Energy Assessment & Solutions (EA&S)



SDG&E will continue to provide energy audits thru our Energy Assessment and Solutions Program (EA&S) to assist in the approval of Prop 39 Energy Expenditure Plans

<u>Summary of EA&S Program to date:</u>

Audits Completed: 131

Total Potential kWh Savings: ~19M

7 school districts with approved Energy Expenditure Plans (EEP)

- ~\$8.5M EEP approved funding
- ~5.3M annual kWh savings
- ~\$1.1M annual cost savings



SDG&E Service Territory Prop 39 Results-To-Date



- 48 approved EEP's
- \$47.5 million in Prop 39 encumbered funds
- Estimated annual energy savings 15 mil kWh
- Estimated annual cost savings \$3.3 million
- Estimated GHG reduction 9.4 million pounds CO2 emissions
- Estimated demand reduction 4.7 MW
- Estimated job years created 192

2016 Strategic Objectives



- Support the remaining 27 school districts in securing their first CEC EEP approval
- Establish best practices in M&V reporting
- Launch Ad Hoc Energy Storage Working Group
- Share learnings from ZNE pilot project with SDUSD
- Continue K-12 Schools Energy Conservation Competition
- Support all K-12 school districts in installation and commissioning of all Prop 39 projects
